### Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric

## Fabrics A, B, C, D, F, G, I, J, M, N, O, P, and R, cut from each:

(4)  $2^{\prime}\!\!/_{2}$  " x WOF (6.35cm x WOF); sub-cut (6)  $2^{\prime}\!\!/_{2}$  " (6.35cm) squares, (18)  $2^{\prime}\!\!/_{2}$  " x  $4^{\prime}\!\!/_{2}$  " (6.35cm x 11.43cm), and (6)  $2^{\prime}\!\!/_{2}$  " x  $6^{\prime}\!\!/_{2}$  " (6.35cm x 16.51cm)

#### Fabric E, H, K, L, and Q, cut from each:

(3)  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x WOF (6.35cm x WOF); sub-cut (4)  $2\frac{1}{2}$  (6.35cm) squares, (12)  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $4\frac{1}{2}$  (6.35cm x 11.43cm), and (4)  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x  $6\frac{1}{2}$  (6 35cm x 16.51cm)

#### Fabric S, cut:

(10)  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x WOF (6.35cm x WOF), for binding

#### Fabric T, cut:

(13)  $2\frac{1}{2}$  x WOF (6.35cm x WOF); sub-cut (196)  $2\frac{1}{2}$  (6.35cm) squares. Cut (98) squares once diagonally to make (196) corner triangles.

(4) 6½" x WOF (16.51cm x WOF); sub-cut (49) 2½" x 6½" (6.35cm x 16.51cm)

(17)  $4\frac{1}{2}$  x WOF (10.80cm x WOF); sub-cut (147)  $4\frac{1}{2}$  (10.80cm) squares. Cut all the squares twice diagonally to make (588) side triangles.


(10) 5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF (13.97cm x WOF)

## Sewing

All seam allowances are  $\frac{1}{4}$  " (.64cm) wide and pieces are sewn right sides together.

**Note:** The assembly method is the same for all blocks, substituting the appropriate fabric squares and rectangles as shown in the block illustrations.

1. Arrange the pieces for each block in rows as shown in **Figure 1**.



- Sew the pieces together within each row, adding in the Fabric T corner and side triangles as indicated.
- **3.** Sew the rows together in order. To help line up the rows correctly, fold each row in half and finger-press a crease, then line up the creases in the rows to make sure the center of each row is properly positioned
- Trim the block to 11<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" (29.85cm) square, making sure to leave <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" (.64cm) outside each of the points.
- Repeat Steps 1-4, to make the number of blocks from each fabric as indicated in Figure 2 on page 4. Label each block with its fabric letter for easier assembly.


## **Quilt Top Assembly**

- 6. Following the **Quilt Layout** on page 5 , lay out the blocks in (7) rows of (7) blocks each. Sew the blocks together in each row, pressing seams in alternate directions for adjacent rows. Sew the rows together in order and press the seams in one direction.
- Sew together (5) 5½" x WOF (13.97cm x WOF) strips end to end and cut (2) 5½" x 79¼" (13.97cm x 201.30cm) border strips. Sew (1) strip to each side of the quilt.
- 8. Sew together the remaining (5) 5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF (13.97cm x WOF) strips end to end and cut (2) 5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 89<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" (13.97cm x 226.70cm) border strips. Sew (1) strip to the top and the other to the bottom of the quilt.

## Finishing

- Sew together the (10) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF (6.35cm x WOF)
  Fabric S binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- **10.** Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
- 11. Leaving an 8" (20.32cm) tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" (30.48cm) from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" (.64cm) and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
- **12.** Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
